PROGRESS FOR OUR NATION

Boosting the Economy

Under Nancy's leadership, Congress increased the minimum wage for the first time in 10 years; put recovery rebates into the hands of 130 million American families; and saved 300,000 good-paying jobs by meeting the shortfall in the Highway Trust Fund.



Fighting to End the War in Iraq

Nancy Pelosi repeatedly led Democrats to demand a new direction in Iraq to protect our troops and make America more secure. Under her leadership, the House repeatedly approved timetables for bringing our troops home from Iraq.

Supporting Veterans

Thanks to Nancy Pelosi's leadership, Congress passed the largest increase in veterans' health care funding in the 77-year history of the Veterans Administration and enacted a new G.I. Bill to send veterans of the Iraq and Afghanistan wars to college.



Achieving Energy Independence

Nancy Pelosi fought to make sure that for the first time in 32 years, Congress passed a law improving vehicle fuel efficiency standards and invested in renewable American energy.



PROGRESS FOR OUR PEOPLE

Providing Health Care to Children

Nancy Pelosi led the House vote to reauthorize and expand the Children's Health Insurance Program to cover low and moderate-income children. President Bush vetoed this bill, but Nancy will work to pass it again and urge support from the next President.



Preserving Medicare for Seniors

When President Bush vetoed the bill preventing cuts to Medicare for seniors, Nancy rallied Democrats to override the veto. The override passed the House on July 15, 2008.



Making College Affordable for Students

In the largest expansion of college aid since the GI Bill in 1944, the New Direction Congress enacted the College Cost Reduction and Access Act, which will boost financial aid by \$20 billion over the next five years.



Supporting Families Through Stem Cell Research

With more than 100 million Americans suffering from Parkinson's, Alzheimer's, diabetes and other debilitating diseases, Nancy led House Democrats in passing a bill to expand federal funding for stem cell research. Although President Bush vetoed the legislation, Nancy will fight to make it law under the new Administration.

PROGRESS FOR OUR NEIGHBORHOODS

Funded Hunters Point Clean-up

For the environmental clean-up of the former Hunters Point Naval shipyard, Nancy Pelosi brought an additional \$82 million home to make way for housing and retail space.



Restored AIDS Funding

When the Bush Administration cut funding for primary medical care, access to counseling, support, outreach services, transitional and emergency housing for 19,000 San Franciscans living with HIV/AIDS, Nancy Pelosi fought back and restored the funding.

Expanded Funding for Affordable Housing

Through her efforts, and despite funding cutbacks by the Bush Administration and the Republican Congress, San Francisco received \$118 million to fund mixed-income public housing in the Mission, North Beach, Bernal Heights, the Western Addition and Hayes Valley neighborhoods.

Preserving the Presidio

Since its transition from a military base to a national recreation area, preserving the scenic and recreational resources of the Presidio has been a priority for Nancy. Now, she's helping to make it financially self-sufficient.
